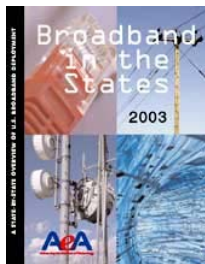

Key Findings...

- Broadband subscriptions up 488 percent since December 1999.
- Broadband jumped from 2.8 million in December 1999 to 16.2 million in June 2002.
- Broadband growth recently slowed to 27 percent between December 2001 and June 2002, the slowest rate of growth since December 1999.
- California, New York, Florida, Texas, and New Jersey top states by broadband subscribers.
- Massachusetts, New Jersey, California, the District of Columbia, and Alaska lead in broadband subscriptions on a per household basis.

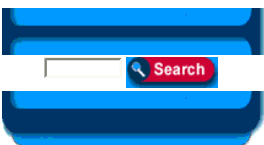
